

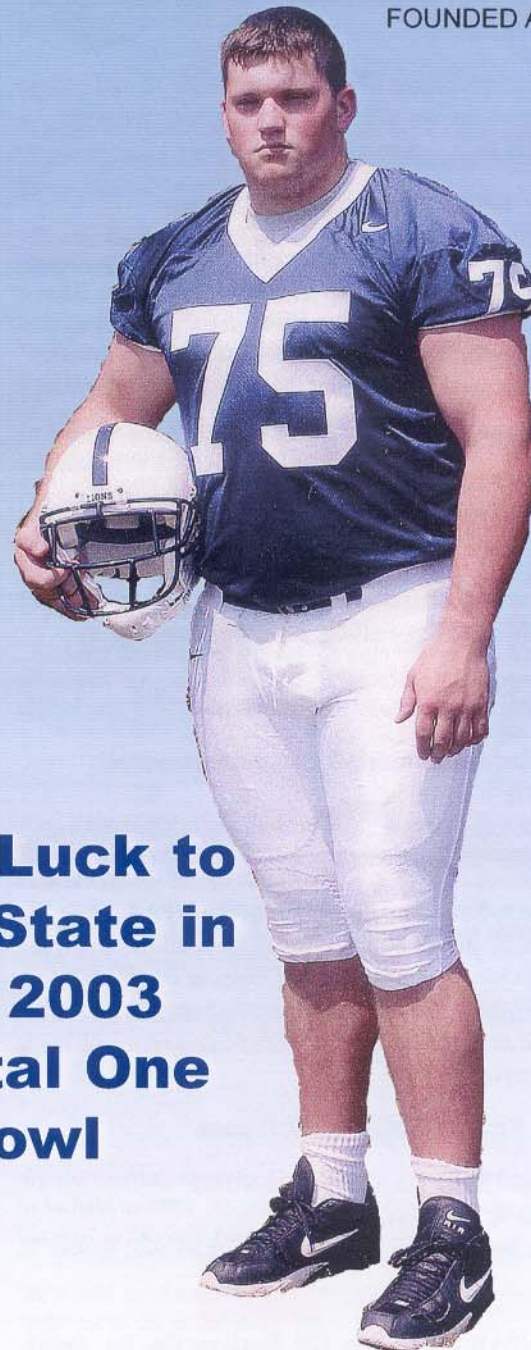
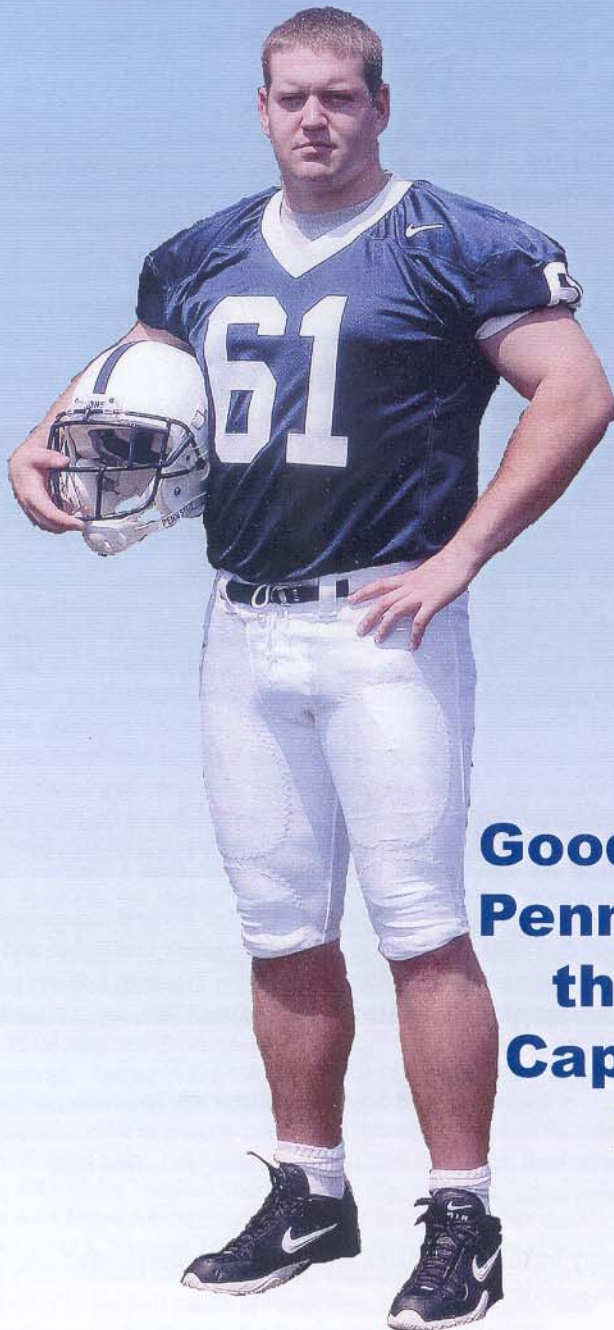

In Memoriam

HESTON D. LEIDY, aged nearly 85, of Souderton, died Tuesday, Oct. 8, 2002 at Grandview Hospital, where he had been hospitalized. He was the husband of F. Betty Leidy, with whom he celebrated 60 years of marriage in August.

Born in Lansdale. His parents moved the family to a farm in former Leidytown, where Heston grew up. He graduated from the new Hatfield Joint Consolidated School in 1935, having spent grades 1- 12 there.

Heston played basketball and baseball at HHS, in the locally wide area, and in the Philadelphia area. He pitched for the Souderton YMCAs and a number of local baseball teams.

Heston joined the Harleysville Lions Club in 1947 and served as their treasurer for two years. He became secretary in 1954, a position he still held at the time of his death. He was also treasurer of the North Penn/SA Sports Hall of Fame since 1993.

He received the Melvin Jones Award, the highest recognition given by Lions' International for outstanding leadership and distinguished service. He also received the Norman I. Bergey Award, granted by the Harleysville Lions Club, for outstanding service.

Tony led the North Penn High School Swim Team to its First Pennsylvania State Championship. He placed first in the 200 Yd Freestyle and set a State Record in the 500 Yd Freestyle. He anchored the 4 x 100 Freestyle Relay that also broke the State Record. Tony earned High School All-American Honors in the 500 Yd Freestyle and the 4 x 100 yd Relay.

Tony earned a full scholarship to UCLA where he was a four-time All-American and Team Captain. He was a finalist in 200 Yd Butterfly, 500 Yd Freestyle, 800 Yd Free Relay, and the 400 Yd Free Relay. He placed fourth in the 1976 Olympic Trials.

In 1980, Tony was a member of the honorary Olympic Travel Team.

Tony currently lives in Lansdale and is the owner of Tom Brown, Inc., a distributor of construction adhesives and foam adhesives for manufacturing.

Tony was inducted into the North Penn / Souderton Area Sports Hall of Fame in May of 2000.

Gerson "Gus" Rosenberg, a Jane A. Fetter Professor of Surgery, Professor of Bioengineering, Chief of the Division of Artificial Organs at Milton S. Hershel Medical Center and the College of Medicine, and a pioneer in the design and development of pumps to assist or replace failing hearts, has been named "2002 Engineer of the Year" by the readers of Design News Magazine. Rosenberg was honored at the Ritz Carlton Hotel, Chicago. His award included \$25,000 in educational grants from the Torrington Co., Torrington, CT, which will go to the College of Engineering, Department of Biomedical Engineering at the University.

Gus is a 1962 NPHS graduate. He received a Ph.D. in Mechanical Engineering in 1975 from The Pennsylvania State University. He was head of the Penn State Research Team which invented the artificial heart.
